A minimum of 3.0 high school credits of math are required for high school graduation.

\*\* At least 2.0 high school credits of the 3.0 high school credits required for graduation must be lab science. Lab science courses taken for science requirement must be at least 5 college credits. At Everett Community College, NUTR 180, STEM 102, and STEM 103 are approved for high school science credit.
